Bristol Bay Region Career & Technical Education has been developing a Fisheries Pathway for the region's four school districts. Requirements to receive .5 High School Credit

- The Checklist is found on the registration form at bbrcte.org. The Captain or Site Lead must review this form; the student must be proficient in at least 10 of the skills/knowledge listed to receive credit. If the skill does not apply to your gear type or location, please leave blank.
- 2. The student must work on the boat/site for a minimum of 14 days to receive .5 credit.
- 3. Grades 9-12 are eligible. (If you are an 8th grader now, you may apply now since this will apply to your freshmen year)
